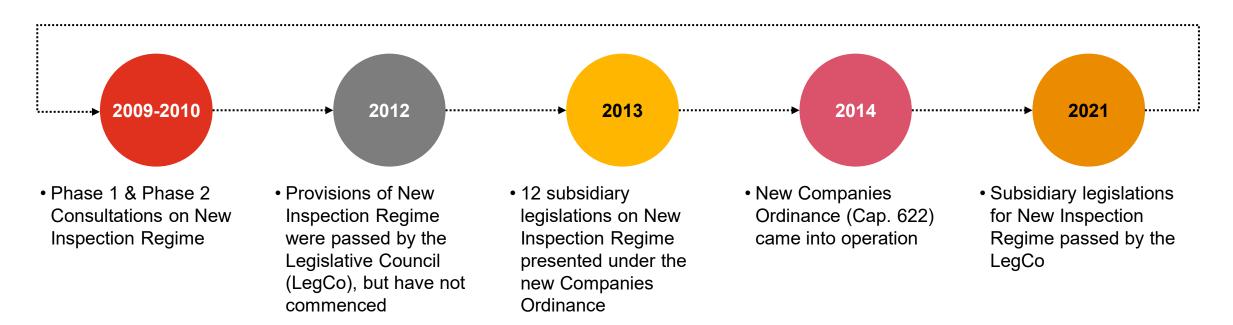

Development of New Inspection Regime



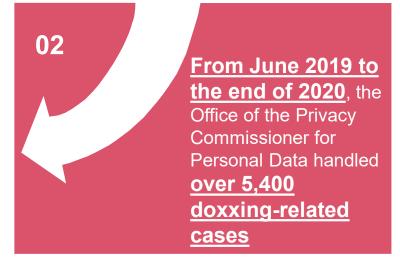


Rising community concern over personal data privacy









- Personal Information available for public inspection
 - <u>before implementation of New Inspection Regime</u>

The Companies Register ("the Register") maintained by the Companies Registry ("the Registry") contains personal information available for public inspection. Such personal information includes, among other data, the usual residential addresses ("URAs") and full identification numbers ("IDNs") of directors of companies, and full IDNs of company secretaries and some other individuals (such as liquidators and provisional liquidators). Similar personal information is also contained in the registers (i.e. register of directors and register of company secretaries) kept by companies which are open for public inspection.

- Personal Information available for public inspection
 - upon full operation of New Inspection Regime

Pursuant to the relevant provisions of the Companies Ordinance (Cap. 622) ("CO") concerning the New Inspection Regime, correspondence addresses instead of URAs of directors and partial IDNs instead of full IDNs of directors, company secretaries and other relevant persons would be made available on the Register for public inspection.

The URAs and full IDNs ("**Protected Information**") would only be accessible by "Specified Persons" upon application. Similarly, companies may withhold from public inspection the Protected Information on the registers they have kept.

Aims of making the relevant provisions of New Inspection Regime

Enhancing protection for personal information while ensuring transparency of the Companies Register by allowing the public to continue inspecting the Companies Register for the purposes under the CO.



Three Phases of New Inspection Regime

Three Phases of New Inspection Regime

Implementation timeline & key features

Phase 1

Effective from 23 August 2021

 Companies may replace URAs of directors with their correspondence addresses, and replace full IDNs of directors and company secretaries with their partial IDNs on their own registers for public inspection.

Phase 2

Effective from 24 October 2022

 Protected Information on the Index of Directors on the Register will be replaced with correspondence addresses and partial IDNs for public inspection. Protected Information contained in documents filed for registration after commencement of this phase will not be provided for public inspection. "Specified Persons" could apply to the Registry for access to Protected Information of directors and other persons.

Phase 3

Effective from 27 December 2023

 Data subjects could apply to the Registry for protecting from public inspection their Protected Information contained in documents registered with the Registry ("Withheld Information"), and replace such information with their correspondence addresses and partial IDNs. "Specified Persons" could apply to the Registry for access to Withheld Information of directors and other persons.

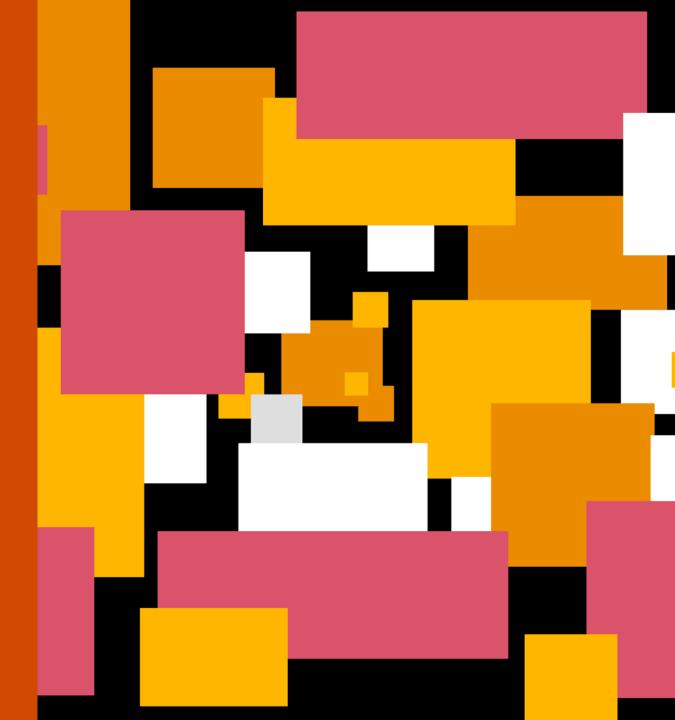
Three Phases of New Inspection Regime

❖ Why is New Inspection Regime implemented in three phases?

Substantial system and operation modifications of the Integrated Companies Registry Information System ("ICRIS") are involved.

Revamp project for upgrading the ICRIS is targeted to complete in end of 2023

ICRIS can then cope with the requirements for full operation of New Inspection Regime Actions required by a local company after commencement of Phase 1 of New Inspection Regime



Phase 1 – Actions required (for directors' correspondence address)

	Actions required
Phase 1 (Commencing from 23 August 2021)	A company's register of directors is required to contain a correspondence address of its director (including reserve director) who is a natural person and such address <u>must not be a post office box number</u> .
	*Pursuant to section 643(1)(a)(ii), (2)(b) or (3)(b) (in so far as it relates to a correspondence address) and section 643(5) of the CO.

Phase 1 – Timeline & Transitional Arrangements

	Transitional Arrangements
Phase 1 (Commencing from 23 August 2021)	The register of directors of a company need not contain a specified director's correspondence address before the company's first annual return date on or after the commencement date of Phase 2 (i.e. 24 October 2022) of the New Inspection Regime, unless –
	 (i) the particulars of the specified director are first entered in the register of directors on or after the commencement date of Phase 2; or (ii) any change is made to the particulars of the specified director contained in the register of directors on or after the commencement date of Phase 2.
	The address of the company's registered office is to be regarded as the correspondence address of the specified director until whichever is the earlier of the following –
<u></u>	(i) the date on which the company enters the specified director's correspondence address in its register of directors;(ii) the company's first annual return date on or after the commencement date of Phase 2.

Phase 1 – Timeline & Transitional Arrangements

	Transitional Arrangements
Phase 1 (Commencing from 23 August 2021)	Before the commencement of Phase 2 (i.e. 24 October 2022), a company does not need to deliver to the Registrar of Companies ("the Registrar") a notice under section 645(4) of the CO for — (i) entering in the company's register of directors a correspondence address of a specified director; or (ii) making any change to a specified director's correspondence address contained in the company's register of directors. However, if, immediately before the commencement of Phase 2,
Ç	a) a specified director's correspondence address was contained in the company's register of directors; and b) such address was not the address of the company's registered office, the company is required to deliver to the Registrar a notice under section 645(4) in relation to the specified director's correspondence address within 15 days after the commencement of Phase 2 (i.e. 8 November 2022).

Phase 1 – Actions required (for URA and IDN)

	Actions required
Phase 1 (Commencing from 23 August 2021)	A company may withhold from public inspection the URA and full IDN (except the first part) of a director (including a reserve director) contained in its register of directors, and the full IDN (except the first part) of a company secretary contained in its register of company secretaries. However, this is NOT a mandatory requirement.
	*Pursuant to sections 644 and 651 of the CO, and the Companies Records (Inspection and Provision of Copies) (Amendment) Regulation 2021.



- Changes made on the registers will not affect the information reported/kept by the Registry
- The Registry continues to keep records of URA and full IDN

Phase 1 – Withholding IDN of a director or company secretary contained in registers from public inspection

Pursuant to the Companies Records (Inspection and Provision of Copies) (Amendment) Regulation 2021, a company may -

 withhold from public inspection the number of an identity card or a passport of a director (including a reserve director) or company secretary except the first part of the number.

What is the first part of IDN?

If the number of an IDN comprises a sequence of an <u>even</u> number of alphanumeric characters

the first half of the sequence

If the IDN comprises a sequence of an <u>Odd</u> number of alphanumeric characters

 the part that begins with the first character in the sequence and ends with the character that falls on the middle of the sequence

Register of Directors

Pursuant to section 641 of the CO:-

- A company must keep in the English or Chinese language a register of directors.
- Subject to section 56(5), (6)(a) and (7)(a), a company must enter in the register of directors the required particulars specified in section 643 of each person who is a director or reserve director (if any) of the company.
- A company must keep the register of directors at—
 - (a) the company's registered office; or
 - (b) a prescribed place.

Register of Directors

Pursuant to section 643 of the CO, register of directors must contain the following particulars with respect to each director—

- i. the present forename and surname, former forename or surname (if any), and aliases (if any);
- ii. the usual residential address and a correspondence address; and
- iii. the number of the identity card or, if the director does not have an identity card, the number and issuing country of any passport held by the director.

Register of Company Secretaries

Pursuant to section 648 of the CO:-

- A company must keep in the English or Chinese language a register of company secretaries.
- A company must enter in the register of company secretaries the required particulars specified in section 650 of a person who is, or persons who are the company secretary or joint company secretaries of the company.
- A company must keep the register of company secretaries at—
 - (a) the company's registered office; or
 - (b) a prescribed place.

Register of Company Secretaries

Pursuant to section 650 of the CO, register of company secretaries must contain the following particulars with respect to the company secretary or, if there are joint company secretaries, with respect to each of them—

- if the company secretary is a natural person—
- the present forename and surname, former forename or surname (if any), and aliases (if any);
- ii. the correspondence address; and
- iii. the number of the identity card or, if the company secretary does not have an identity card, the number and issuing country of any passport held by the company secretary; and
- if the company secretary is a body corporate, the corporate name and the address of its registered or principal office.

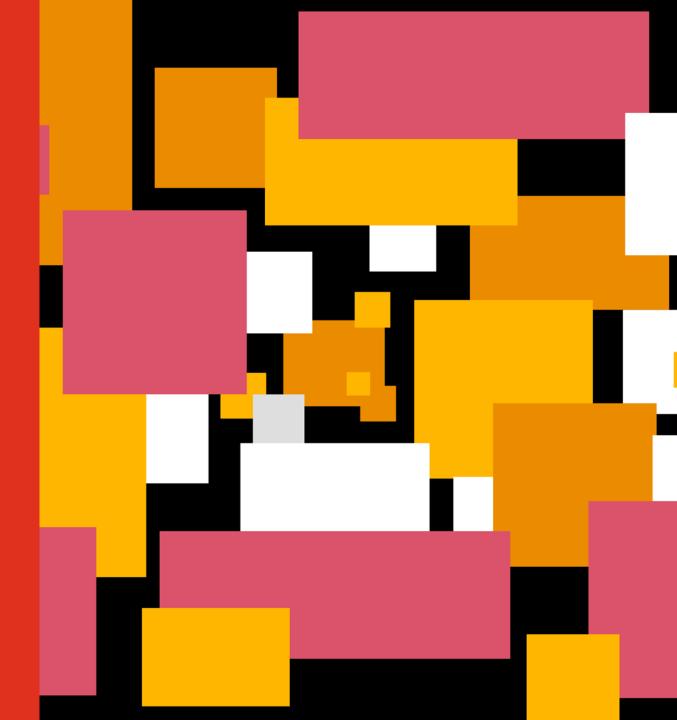

	Implementation Details
Phase 2 (Commencing from 24 October 2022)	Protected Information (i.e. URAs and full IDNs) on the Index of Directors on the Companies Register will be replaced with correspondence addresses and partial IDNs for public inspection.

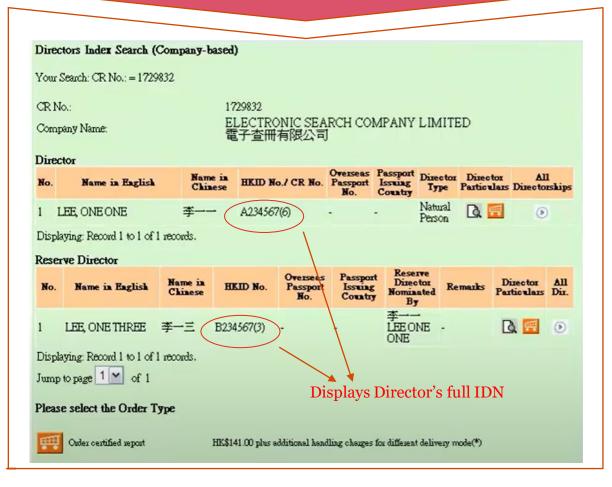

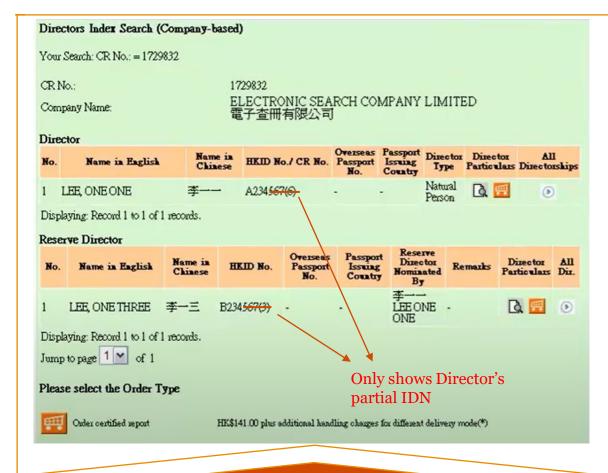

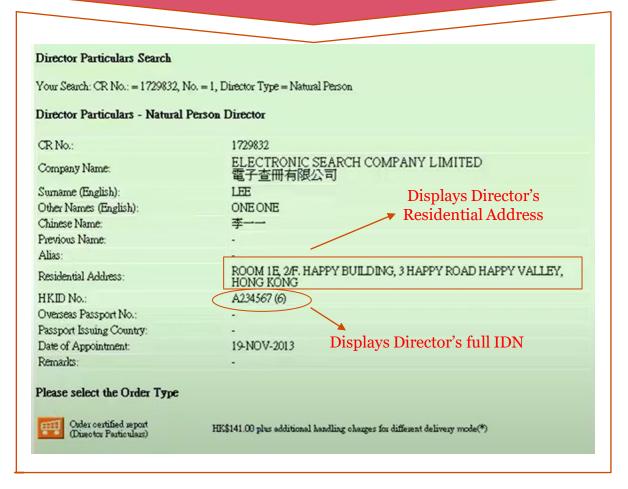

Phase 2 – Implementation Details (2)

	Implementation Details
Phase 2 (Commencing from 24 October 2022)	 Documents filed for registration with the Registry <u>after commencement of Phase 2</u>:- report correspondence address of directors and partial IDNs of relevant individuals contain Protected Information <u>but</u> Protected Information will be withheld from public inspection
	(Note: The public can still conduct company search to obtain the previously filed documents which contain Protected Information)

Revision of Specified Forms

- To facilitate the implementation of Phase 2 of the New Inspection Regime, 26 specified forms
 which pertain to the reporting of Protected Information have been revised.
- The revised specified forms:
 - i. were published in the Gazette (G.N.3130 and 3168) on 24 June 2022
 - ii. starting from 22 July 2022, can be downloaded from the thematic section on "New Inspection Regime" on the Registry's website at www.cr.gov.hk/en/legislation/nir/forms.htm
 - iii. will be available for purchase at the Registry's office on the 14th floor of the Queensway Government Offices, 66 Queensway, Hong Kong with effect from 23 September 2022

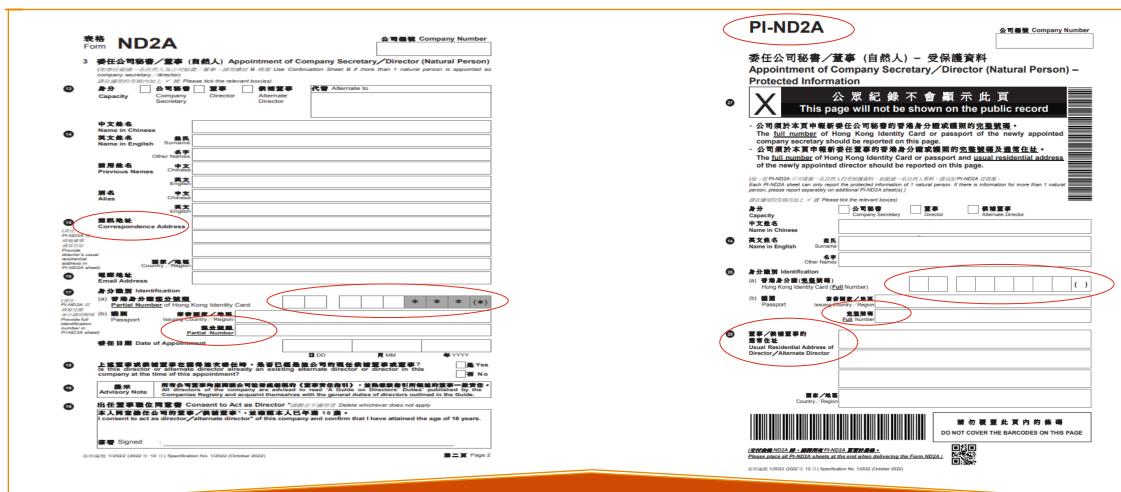

Phase 2 – Access to Protected Information

Application made by the Specified Persons for access to Protected Information:

How to apply?

- Online application (through Cyber Search Centre: <u>www.icris.cr.gov.hk</u> or Company Search Mobile Services: <u>www.mobile-cr.gov.hk</u>)
- Paper application (must be in the specified form)

Supporting documents:-

- For an application made by a person authorised by a data subject an authorisation letter by the data subject
- Specified Persons (4) (10) need to confirm that the Protected Information
 - a. is required for performance of their function purpose; and
 - b. would only be used for that purpose

Phase 2 – Access to Protected Information

Application made by the Specified Persons for access to Protected Information:

How much to pay?

- Specified Persons (1) to (7): exemption from fees
- Specified Persons (8) to (10): a fee of HK\$10 for obtaining Protected Information of each data subject

Phase 3 (Commencing from 27 December 2023)	 Data subjects could apply to the Registry to withhold their Protection Information contained in documents filed <u>before commencement of Phase 2</u> Ex-data subjects could also apply to the Registry to withhold their Protection Information in: a company that is still in existence 	
	 a dissolved company "Specified Persons" could continue to apply to the Registry for access to Protected Information

Implications and Key Takeaways

Who may be affected by the New Inspection Regime?

General Public & Searchers including:-

- A party intending to transact or deal with a company registered with the Registry and to perform a due diligence check against such company including the identities of its directors
- A service provider intending to perform a know-your-customer check against a company registered with the Registry

Implications

- Only able to access the correspondence address of a director instead of his/her URA, and the partial IDN of a director or a company secretary instead of his/her full IDN
- Only access to the Protection Information through Specified Persons.
- When conducting any searches, the searcher (including any Specified Persons) should consider carefully and take necessary measures to ensure the accuracy of the Purpose(s) indicated in conducting searches.

Who may be affected by the New Inspection Regime?

Companies registered with the Registry & their respective directors and company secretaries

Implications

- Companies can protect the Protected Information of their directors and company secretaries.
- Companies, directors and company secretaries should consider their approach to limit disclosure of Protected Information.

Key Takeaways on the way forward



Phase 1

Consider to limit disclosure of Protected Information in the companies' statutory registers



Phase 2

Discuss with directors if he/she would like to use other designated address (i.e. not the registered office address) as his/her correspondence address (CA). If yes, the company is required to deliver to the Registry a specified form in relation to the CA after commencement of this Phase.

Key Takeaways on the way forward



Phase 2 (Con't)

Update Register of Directors and Register of Company Secretaries after commencement of this Phase.

	Register of Directors	Register of Company Secretaries
For own record	Must contain CA, URA and full IDN	Must contain CA and full IDN (URA not required since 2014)
For public inspection	May withhold Protected Information (URA and full IDN) - <i>not mandatory</i>	May withhold full IDN - not mandatory

Phase 2 (Con't)

Access Protection Information through Specified Persons

- consider performing due diligence investigation against a company and its directors through person authorised by data subject or lawyer etc.



Phase 3

Companies, directors and company secretaries should consider to make application to the Registry for replacing the URAs and full IDNs of directors and company secretaries on documents filed with the Registry before Phase 2 with their CA and partial IDNs.
